Dr. Stell will remain in Auburn at the Fish Ecology Lab supported by an ORISE fellowship in association with the US Army Corps of Engineers.






NEW PhD GRADUATE

Liina will provide badly needed administrative support to all SFAAS activities on the coast.




NEW STAFF MEMBER

Along with her career interests in coastal ecology, she enjoys running, reading, and scuba diving.




ENVIRONMENTAL CONFERENCE


